

Voting is now open for our incoming slate of national officers. Go to <u>http://www.aauw.org/resource/national-</u> <u>election/</u> and meet the impressive women who want to lead us for the coming cycle. Then check out the seven (7) proposed changes to our by-laws.

We are again being asked to vote on removing the degree requirement from our membership eligibility. There are also six (6) proposed changes to the Public Policy Program and two (2) resolutions to consider. Last day for online voting is June 15th, but don't wait. You will need your individual member number and voting link which you received in a special e-mail from Mark Hopkins on April 10th.

This interactive event will be comprised of three workshops: Fun with Energy, Coding Camp, and Prisms: Color and Angles. Participants will rotate through the workshops in small groups.
