


The Tech Trek Committee has completed the selection process for this year's Trekkers and, once again, it was VERY difficult to choose among the 31 impressive 7th grade STEM enthusiasts who were nominated by their science and math teachers. But we have chosen our 8 campers for 2017 along with 3 alternates. By the time you read this, all nominees will have received their notifications

We are happy to report that this year, we have a comprehensive list of STEM resources for parents and students (especially middle school girls) that includes other Bay Area STEM summer camps. This will be going out to all of our nominees who were not chosen. (The list will go to our Trekkers as well, but after camp.)

It was recently announced that after the 2017 camps all Tech Trek camp management will be returned to the states involved. The current decision was the result of a National Board review of the core mission of AAUW in order to decide where to best focus their efforts. National believes that the states can better manage the camps while National can still recruit corporate donors for the nationwide program.

The move to National control in 2015 was intended as a two year pilot to see if it was feasible for National to handle the management of the 21 camps nationwide.

The impact on our local branch returning to AAUW-CA management will be almost zero. The only expected change may be how we write our donation checks and/or how online donations are handled after September 2017. Stay tuned for details in the fall!

Plans for our pilot initiative, in partnership with Expanding Your Horizons, are coming together nicely! We expect to hold an interactive STEAM event in May for a small group of 5th Grade girls in the Livermore Valley Unified School District. The event will run for approximately three hours and will be comprised of three workshops. Participants will rotate through the workshops in small groups.

Workshop topics will be: Fun with Energy, Computer Coding and Light & Prisms. We had a run-through of the workshops at our last meeting and we all agreed they were going to be fun and engaging!

Our committee members will lead these workshops and we hope to have former Tech Trekkers and/or high school girls serve as aides. If the pilot is successful the plan would be to expand the program next year to multiple events, drawing upon the EYH database of women in STEM careers for workshop leaders.

Tri-Valley Women's March Action Group

The recently formed Tri-Valley Women's March Action Group held their second "huddle" at Inklings Café on Main Street in Pleasanton on Tuesday evening, March 14. This group states "Our core values are to be positive, inclusive, action-oriented and grounded in the tradition of nonviolent resistance. We'll work toward an equitable, just, safe, and free world."

The March 14th program included a talk by a woman born in Iran, whose family immigrated to the U.S. when she was a small child. She is a U.S. citizen but, of course, her passport shows that she was born in Iran. She spoke about her journey and about the impact of current "Muslim Ban" has had on her and her family. The meeting then broke into sub-groups to discuss areas of interest such as Immigration/Muslim Ban/Human Rights, Environment/Climate Change, Health Care, Russian Investigation/Cabinet choices and Mid-term Elections.

The group's Facebook page (<u>https://www.facebook.com/TriValleyWomjensMarchActionGroup/</u>) is a wealth of information resources on the above subjects, including many opportunities for "couch activism" (sending emails, making calls to legislators, etc.).
