The exploratory committee considering possible collaboration between our Branch and Expanding Your Horizons (EYH) met in a lively brainstorming session on Nov. 14. Topline conclusions of objectives for this year were:

Plan 1-2 <u>small</u>, pilot events (if 2: same event, held in 2 locations)

- Should be easy to replicate, even in rural/low technical resource geographical areas
- Don't duplicate what's already out there
- Target audience,  $4^{th} 5^{th}$  grade girls
- Must be hands-on
- Look to meld math/science/STEM with art => STEAM, if possible

The committee currently has 12 members, including 2 EYH National Board members. Mekena Metcalf and Karen Cowan are co-chairing the committee. The next planning meeting was held on Tuesday, Jan. 24, 3-5 pm, at Karen Cowan's house (2273 St. Charles Ct, Livermore).
