It's the busiest, but most exciting, time of the year for the the Trek Committee! Nominations for Camp Curie at Stanford in July 2017 are in from our local middle schools. We have 31 nominees this year from which we'll have the difficult task of selecting 8 campers and 1-2 alternates.

We are happy to report that we have sufficient funds to send 9 girls to camp this year; we have requested an additional slot, but will only get that if another branch is unable to fill all of their requested camper spots.

We'll be interviewing all 31 girls in early March and will have our 2017 campers and alternates selected by the end of March. We are looking forward to meeting this year's candidates!



Here's another excerpt from a note we received from one of last year's Trekkers:

"Thank you so much for the opportunity to attend Tech Trek. It was amazing to get to stay at Stanford for a week and meet so many different girls and women with similar interests. I also found it fascinating to learn so much about forensic science and other STEM subjects. I think my favorite part was doing experiments in my core class. We extracted DNA from strawberries, stamped fingerprints and (did) other genetic experiments. I learned so much about genetics and solving crime. Going to Tech Trek and meeting so many women in the science field has really inspired me to keep learning, do my best and pursue a STEM career."


