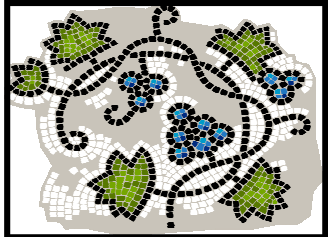

Our American Association of University Women-Livermore-Pleasanton-Dublin (AAUW-LPD) branch is like many others in that we focus on local events--what can we do in our community to increase financial and educational opportunities for women?

Steam Diva's held their first planning meeting for the 2018-19 school year on Monday May 14, 3:30-4:30 PM, at Inkling's Coffee & Tea (Backroom), 530 Main Street, Pleasanton.

The committee agreed to keep the program to a ½-day Saturday morning event in late October to early November. The date and location, preferably Junction Avenue Middle School, will be determined by LVJUSD based on discussions with the district. The program will continue to serve 5th grade girls in Livermore who would participate in three 50-minute workshops. The target attendance was set at 50 girls. The committee agreed to keep the \$5 registration fee, with scholarships available for those who request one, the same as last year.

The planning committee, co-chaired by Ann Willoughby and Mekena Metcalf welcomes new members. The level of engagement for most committee volunteers is 1-2 hours per month. Day-of volunteers to assist at the STEAM Divas event are also needed. If you are interested in learning more about STEAM Divas, please contact Ann Willoughby at akwilloughby@att.net.



PLANNING FOR COLLEGE also has begun planning for the 2018-19 school year. The intent is to expand on the initial program piloted with Tech Trek applicants. The pilot was successful and we plan to offer a similar program; however, it will be held in November and focused on 9th and 10th grade girls in the Tri-Valley. Exact registration numbers will be determined by the size facility we can secure.

In the spring we will offer a program for 10th graders (rising 11th graders.) This will include Student Tests (SAT, SAT II, ACT etc.), how to create a college list, how to create a college profile and match theirs to the colleges, what environment they want, how to pick a major and much more.

Diane Keller will chair this committee and new members are welcome. The next meeting is June 13, 2:00 at Diane's home. The level of engagement for most committee volunteers is approximately 1-2 hours per month.

Planet 50-50 by 2030
Step It Up for Gender Equality

We received positive feedback from the L-PD members who attended the May 2 presentation by Kathleen Cha about her experience with the United Nations Committee on the Status of Women and support of gender equity issues.

The 50-50 movement mentioned at the event produced a video (<http://www.letitripple.org/films/50-50/5050-day/>). In 20 minutes it reviews progress that has been made worldwide in supporting female leadership. It was presented at the AAUW-CA convention. Issues encountered this month:

1) **Frequency of e-mail to branch members**-Our board realizes that requests to send "blasts" to our membership - both from branch members and from other branches- have increased. In order to reach a compromise between using the Grapevine only or sending everything as they appear, we're developing a system of WEEKLY LPD reminders/updates. Sandy Hansen (mailto:info@aauw-lpd.org) will be handling them - so if you have something that needs relatively quick distribution, please send to her. There may be times she'll need to consult with our branch President so be patient. We'll call the blast UPDATE FROM AAUW-LPD, with the date in the subject line. They'll be distributed on Friday mornings as much as possible. Content might be something developing that needs a quick response, reminders of committee or interest group meetings, an *ad hoc* added event of some sort, etc. Exceptions will be made for cancellation of events or death notices - which will go out ASAP. If the interest groups wish, separate email groups can be established. We expect this system to get a good trial this summer while we are between Grapevines. Carol will continue to edit and distribute the Grapevine (THANKS CAROL!), but Sandy will deal with the other notifications. It's logical, since she maintains the branch email distribution list.

2) **Evites** -  It's taking all of us a while to get a feel for how this system works. Board members are pleased with the adoption of this method. To make it simple, when you receive one of our Evites, please respond ASAP - that way you won't receive reminders.

The system will send you a reminder shortly before the event. When we use them, note the

little  image which might be on the invitation. We might ask your choice on something to eat. Few who responded to the Evites for our annual meeting used the poll. We'll be using the Evite system for our June event, requesting you to use the COMMENT bubble to tell us what you are bringing. Of course those of you without email will need to call Vicki-Dawn.

3) **Technology** - As time staggers on, technology continually changes. If you feel a technology challenge, (or might be a resource), contact Sandy Hansen and let's get together over coffee and see if we can work on your challenge. Sandy does not have all answers, but will diligently work with you to find one (putting those old reference librarian skills to work!) She currently has a TV challenge, but is using a work-around - laptop in the living room with the full Xfinity feed available - until her tech support (son) arrives. What's YOUR challenge?

4) **Members without email** - Yes - we have six members who do not receive email. How do we let them know about content of the UPDATES FROM AAUW LPD? First - we need to know if they WANT to be contacted. Second - we need some volunteers to be their communication buddies. If you fall into either category - please contact Sandy by email - as given or phone at 925/216-4945. Buddies can get to know what sort of things interest those w/o email and filter appropriately.

5) **Branch website** - Finally, as time has changed the way we communicate, our website at <https://lpd-ca.aauw.net/> needs updating/revision. It operates under a limited structure available to us as a site hosted by AAUW National. However, when you visit the site, do you find it easy to use? Does it have the information you seek? Do you have suggestions? Should we have a photo archive (we currently have only 1 photo posted - but many in our archives)? FYI - we had a problem with the search function and National staff are working on a solution. Let's meet over coffee on a Thursday this summer and put our heads together. Watch the weekly update for an announcement - or - send your suggestions to Sandy Hansen and our website manager, Myla Grasso (mail to: webmanager@aauw-lpd.org). We're currently working on aspects of the site that relate to scholarships and STEM activities.

The Big Picture: **There aren't enough women in tech.**

The vast majority of people making decisions at the most influential companies in the world are men. From grand strategy to day-to-day implementation, there aren't enough women authoring our future.

Reuters' **Jennifer Saba** has created [a calculator](#) to show how many years it would take Apple, Google and Facebook to achieve gender parity in their workforces if they each committed to making **51% of new hires** women: Apple: 15, Google: 14, Facebook: 7.

But: 51% is not the current ratio. Far from it. Which means that without bold leadership on gender parity, we're at least several decades away from a world where tech companies reflect the overall makeup of the labor market.

What's standing in the way, via Saba:

- Education: "Less than one-fifth of computer and information science majors are female," according to the National Center for Women & Information Technology.
- Promotion: "Companies entrench the problem by failing to promote women or retain

Notes from AAUW-CA Convention

First and foremost, it was an action packed 3 days and no one person could cover it all. This article will contain a few of my notes and thoughts but for a full scoop with presentations and handouts please go to www.aauw-ca.org/2018-convention-materials/.

The keynote speakers were fabulous. On Friday night Kim Churches, our CEO of AAUW National, spoke. She shared some of her rationale behind the organizational restructure, her desire to change to Board structure, how to keep AAUW relevant and focused moving forward. One pleasant fact concerned her deep financial background and her emphasis on having a balanced budget such as any large business would.

Saturday night Lisa Maatz spoke on Advocacy in the Age of Trump. Lisa has a bi-partisan approach to getting things done. She is an advocate for not just voting by party but remembering that if we do not have moderates across the aisle, then we will not have anyone to negotiate or collaborate with. That certainly gave me something to think about.

During Saturday's open space I attended a session on Strengthening our College Ties. Ideas shared included sponsoring a girl to the National Conference for College Women Student Leaders (NCCWSL), holding Start Smart programs (price has been reduced), approaching affinity groups like those for women in engineering, and approaching women's studies classes/instructors.

The lunch on Saturday featured the 3 finalists in the Speech Trek Competition, 2 young women and 1 young man spoke on How Can We Stand Up to Sexism. I was grateful not to be a judge as they were all wonderful.

I also attended 2 workshops about mentoring and building self esteem in girls. As STEM Outreach Director for L-P-D, these were relevant topics. I met many dedicated women and had an opportunity to discuss common issues that resonated across all branches full of "dangerously educated women."
