Eight branch members attended the AAUW Fund luncheon on October 6. Forty women in California have received AAUW fellowships and grants this year to continue their studies or fund community projects. We heard from several of these women, pursuing studies/careers in areas such as hydrology, law, public policy, business, music, and more. It was inspiring to hear their stories. AAUW has offered such support since 1881, and gave out \$4 million to 259 recipients this year. The endowments that support the studies are well-funded and will last in perpetuity.

AAUW is today moving forward with several "newer" programs, keyed to reach a younger population, as we work toward our longtime goal of equity for all women and girls. The Work Smart and Start Smart programs are gaining national recognition for AAUW. Branches around the nation are hosting group trainings at community locations that have multiple computers so that people in their community can take the online salary negotiation training. AAUW offers the Na-

tional Conference for Women Student Leaders (NCWSSL) annually in the Washington, D.C. areas. Young women from all over the nation attend, network, have a grad school fair, etc. These and more currently-funded projects will take AAUW into the future. However these programs are greatly underfunded.



Two planning for college nights were held in October. On October 8th we had sold out attendance and our own Diane Keller presented to 85 people made up of local 9th and 10th grade girls and their families.

STEAM Divas: 5TH GRADE GIRLS EXPLORE SCIENCE &TECHNOLOGY

STEAM Divas (science, technology, engineering, art, math) brought AAUW LPD branch members and Tri-Valley 5th-grade girls together for its third exploratory event at Junction Avenue K-8 School, Livermore.

Fifty three girls participated in hands-on STEAM-based workshops in October, including *Creative Coding* (led by Carol Kinnard), *Prisms: Color & Angles* (led by Mekena Metcalf), *Fun with Energy* (led by Sarah Palmer), and Life as a Water Molecule (led by Ann King).

Middle-school and high school workshop aides were enthusiastic role models who helped the girl participants with hands-on activities. Most of these aides previously attended AAUW's Tech Trek, a 5-day summer STEM experience for 8th grade girls. Tech Trek is held annually at Stanford University and features dormitory living, meals in a dining hall, and hands-on labs.

Parents heard from supportive special guests Assemblywoman Rebecca Bauer-Kahan, Dr. Kelly Bowers (Livermore Valley USD Superintendent), and Anne White (Livermore Valley USD Board Member).

STEAM Divas is successful because we have incredible volunteers! MORE ABOUT TECH TREK

For those of you new to the Tech Trek program and/or as a refresher for our LPD members, it has a rigorous selection process. The candidates must be recommended by their 7th grade science teachers. With eleven middle schools in the Tri-Valley we could have as many as 44 candidates if all of them recommended the maximum allowed of four per school. In early March the Tech Trek committee spends two very full Saturdays interviewing these young ladies and making our selection. Each candidate is put through the exact same process of writing an essay and completing a twenty minute structured interview with three committee members. We work very hard to be sure each girl experiences the same process and has the same opportunities. Additionally, we take into account teacher comments as we hope to sponsor young women who might not otherwise have an opportunity like this.

This year, unlike the past, we are placing particular emphasis on fundraising. We have been most fortunate in the past not having to focus on fundraising thanks to the generosity of many of you. Due to members relocating and/or aging out we can no longer count on some of those large gifts. If you would like to see this program continue, please do try and support Tech Trek. Starting next month we will report monthly on our fundraising efforts toward our \$9000 annual goal.
