PRESIDENT'S MESSSAGE-DEVON LAHAR

"Deeds, not words." (Alice Paul, American Suffragist)

Suffragette is a movie now streaming on Netflix. I put myself in the place of early 20th century British suffragettes who turned away from peaceful protest to embrace militant tactics in their fight for equality. Could I risk job loss, family unity, physical safety, and public shunning to use "deeds, not words" in a fight for rights? Learn more about the real-life women who inspired this movie.

The women in *Suffragette* faced tremendous odds to gain voting rights for any British woman. They paved the way for our American centennial. The year 2020 marks the 100th anniversary of the passage of the 19th Amendment, guaranteeing and protecting (some) women's constitutional right to vote. The end of the movie Suffragette is sobering: scrolling text lists countries that preceded Britain in giving (some) women the vote, and others that did so later....much later. Recent entries (2005 Kuwait, 2006 United Arab Emirates, 2011 Saudi Arabia) make you consider the rights that each of us has in this country--and why we continue to work for them through AAUW.

Pleasanton's January 18 Make-A-Difference Festival (this year at Pleasanton Senior Center) highlighted so many Tri-Valley volunteer opportunities through non-profit organizations like ours. Thanks to Marilyn Duman for organizing our information table--and to Marilyn and her fellow volunteers Roz Wright, Devon LaHar, Tina Amber, and Chris Alesso for spreading the AAUW-LPD mission of equal economic and educational access for women. I had fun joining these women to check out so many ways to give back to our community through non-profit organizations like ours. We also greeted branch members who share their community volunteering spirit in several other worthy groups represented at this event.





Susan Wacek and I were energized by inspiring local speakers at the January 18 Tri-Valley Women's March! We heard Assembly member Rebecca Bauer-Kahan (granddaughter of refugees who came to the United States to escape the Holocaust), Hayward City Councilmember Aisha Wahab (first Afghan-American woman to be elected to public office in the U.S.), and other speakers talk about working together, standing up, and taking political ac-

tion to promote women's economic and educational equal access.

AAAUW FUND 2019 RECAP AND 2020 CHALLENGE

Goodbye 2019 – Hello 2020. See the article from AAUW: <u>https://www.aauw.org/article/top-10-ways-aauw-made-the-world-better-for-women-in-2019/</u>

The books have closed on 2019 donations. A **big thank you** to the 27 members of our branch who donated a total of \$3505.19 to the AAUW Fund last year.. Special thanks to the following members who generously donated a total of \$2900. Each donated over \$100: Chris Alesso, Dawn Gordner, Sandy Hansen, Barbara Hempill, Pat Kohnen, Pat Mann, Karen Richardson, P J Wells, and Joyce Wies. This is in addition to the support the Fund received through dues paid by members.

A reminder to all as you prepare your tax returns. If you paid full dues last year of \$95, \$56 of those dues are deductible. This is the portion that automatically supports AAUW at the National level and it's programs. AAUW is a top-rated 501(c)(3) charity. Donations are tax deductible. Tax ID#: 52-6037388.

As 2020 begins, we face a challenge from Association – a challenge we can meet. All branches have been challenged to raise \$30 per member for AAUW's GREATEST NEEDS FUND (9110) by June 30. What is the Greatest Needs Fund? Why ANOTHER "Fund"? Think of it as previously known – UNDESIGNATED. This encompasses all of the funds/programs supported by current income, rather than endowments. AAUW has a large endowment that supports our fellowship programs. Income from the endowment funds scholars studying on International, American, and Selected Professions fellowships, as well as AAUW's grants.

However, these well-funded long-traditional programs are NOT the only thing that AAUW is doing as it works to create a world that is equitable for women and girls.

- AAUW is currently empowering women to negotiate for the pay they deserve through it's **Work Smart** program which is committed to reaching 10 million women by 2022. The program has a free online component. Tell the women you know who are in the workforce. Negotiation skills are needed throughout one's career.
- The **AAUW Legal Advocacy Fund** supports women who have brought pay equity, gender equity, and gender discrimination lawsuits in a variety of ways. In addition,
- AAUW continues to conduct research on gender equity issues in education and the workplace. See the separate article in this newsletter, Page 6, on the latest AAUW research.
- Through AAUW's **National Conference for College Women Student Leaders**, AAUW brings students together for a transformative week that inspires them to improve their campuses and their communities. AAUW also presents **Start Smart** salary negotiation workshops on college campuses, providing women with skills as they prepare for their post-college career interviews.
- AAUW works to support **STEM e**ducation, doing research, through advocacy for federal support of women in STEM, providing resources, etc.
- AAUW collaborates with others for global change affecting women and girls, AAUW has special consultative status with the U.N.

NEW RESEARCH FROM AAUW

AAUW released a new research report in November: <u>Limiting</u> <u>Our Livelihoods: The Cumulative Impact of Sexual Harassment</u> <u>on Women's Careers</u>. The report finds that workplace sexual harassment can take a toll on women's physical and mental health, limit their job choices, reduce prospects for career development and even force them out of the workforce. The report concludes that these negative effects compound over time, re-

ducing women's lifetime earnings and contributing to both the gender and retirement wage gaps, The report is based on an AAUW analysis of Equal Employment Opportunity Commission (EEOC) data, a review of academic studies on sexual harassment and an exclusive nationwide survey of AAUW members and their networks.
