Join us on Thursday, October 8, 2020 at 10 AM via Zoom for our biennial discussion of the November Ballot Initiatives.

This year there are twelve. LPD members will be presenting the pros and cons of each initiative along with recommendations from trusted sources like the League of Women Voters. Open discussion will follow each presentation. We will try to hold each initiative to about five minutes.

Access Codes and a reference sheet will be provided in the weekly Friday updates just prior to Oct. 8th.

We're taking a stand! Your California AAUW Public Policy Committee has adopted a YES position on:

- Prop 14 Stem Cell Research (access to quality health care)
- Prop 15 Property Taxes (funding for education)
- Prop 16 Affirmative Action (educational opportunity; social justice)
- Prop 17 Voting for Parolees (expansion of voting rights)
- Prop 18 Voting at 17 (encourages voting)
- Prop 21 Rent Control (affordable housing)
- Prop 25 Cash Bail (social & economic justice)

AAUW has taken NO POSITION on the following propositions:

- **P19** Property Taxes Allows transfer of property tax amounts for older homeowners
- **P20** Criminal Justice Restricts early parole for certain violent crimes
- P22 Gig Workers Makes rideshare and delivery drivers independent contractors
- P23 Dialysis Clinics Mandates new requirements for dialysis clinics
- **P24** Consumer Privacy Expands consumer data privacy laws

About Face: This program will be co-sponsored with the About Face organization and coordinated through Sheryl Morgan. The date has not yet been finalized but we are looking at late February or early March. Pre-registration for Zoom Events

You may have noticed that some of our events require pre-registration. Why? Occasionally we put on an event that is open to the public. By requiring pre-registration we capture emails, possible future interest in joining AAUW-:LPD and can also track how our various forms of publicity are working.

When you see that pre-registration is required, complete it ASAP. You will immediately be sent an email with the zoom link or other information for the meeting. Do not wait to register until the day of the event - in some cases we are limited to how many are able to join a specific event.

We will continue to send out Evites, but only for major events. For all other meetings and ongoing events, look for the Zoom links in the weekly Friday updates. Just a reminder, each meeting has a specific zoom link with the embedded passcode.
