STEM Activity and Girl Programs

I am pleased to share recent activity from the "Girl Programs" team. As you know this group was formed to ensure we would continue to support education for young women and focus on STEM during this unique year.

Planning for College: The first session led by Diane Keller, an AAUW-LPD member and former college adviser was for 9th and 10th graders held October 13. We had over 100 sign-up but like many free programs we had many no shows. Even with that there were almost 60 families listening to the presentation.

The 11th grade program will be held October 20th and while the attendance for that is not available for this month's *Grapevine* we do know that there are 60 families currently registered. The official evaluations have not been returned however, the comments posted in the chat box were very favorable.

Diane, thank you again for not only presenting this valuable program but for being willing to present it in a new format.

We are now turning our focus to the informational career series, **Career Opportunities – STEM** and more.... We settled on this name after reviewing the speaker suggestions we received. It acknowledges both our branches STEM commitment and the reality that STEM is not the only interest or option for young women.

We are currently finalizing our presenters by asking those of you who nominated speakers to verify they are still interested and available for one of the three nights planned for this series. That information is due to PJ Wells by October 25th. Each speaker will have 10-15 minutes to discuss: **Early Life** - interests, hobbies, activities; **High School**- clubs, groups, activities; **College**: education, certifications, affiliations; and **Career Ladder**-stairsteps to success. These will be followed by a short Q & A period.

This 3 part Zoom series is planned for January 14, 28 and February 11 and will be aimed at high school age girls.

RUTH BADER GINSBURG

March 15, 1933 to September 18, 2020

America lost one of our most beloved role models September 18, 2020, a pioneering jurist and iconic feminist who blazed new trails, not only in her own life, but in the lives of the countless women she championed — and inspired. On behalf of AAUW and its members and supporters who recognized Justice Ginsburg with a 1999 AAUW Achievement Award, we extend our condolences to her family, her col-

leagues and to every American whose lives and hearts she touched. The nation owes it to her — and to all women — to honor her final wishes and refrain from naming a replacement until after a new president is inaugurated, if possible.

MAKE YOUR VOICE HEARD

With the loss of Justice Ruth Bader Ginsburg, our country must fight to ensure her successor is a similarly strong advocate for women and families. AAUW believes that, as with all nominations, a full and fair vetting process is vital to determine the nominee's qualifications and temperament. This is fundamentally impossible to achieve in a short time and in light of all the other critical issues the Senate is now addressing. Our nation is reeling from the COVID-19 pandemic, an economic crisis, reckoning with our long and painful history with racism, and how to access the vote in a critical election year. Our fundamental rights are at risk, now more than ever — and the American people need a Supreme Court of independent, fair-minded jurists to protect the rights of all.
