Stimulating Book Talk!

The March 22 **Coffee and Conversation** event co-sponsored by <u>Towne Center Books</u> (Livermore) and our branch featured two authors, <u>Ann Parker</u> and <u>Katherine Gregorio</u>. This well-attended event attracted about 40 members and guests who welcomed good weather at an in-person outdoor gathering held at The Last Word patio!

Parker and Gregorio spoke about the extensive research they undertook to write each of their books: San Francisco's post-Civil War era (Parker's *The Secret in the Wall*) and Russia during the Cold War (Gregorio's *The Double Life of Katherine Clark*). Both authors' books highlight strong female protagonists: Parker's latest mysteries series featuring unique Inez Stennart in *The Secret in the Wall* and Gregario's non-fiction tale *The Double Life of Katherine Clark*, the true story of the author's aunt's adventures as a female journalist in Russia during the 1950s and '60s.

Coffee and cookies sweetened the lively question & answer period following these authors' talks. Thanks to committee members who helped to make this event possible!

Ukrainian Female Authors to check out.....

Oksana Zabuzhko: A talented Ukrainian author, Oksana Zabuzhko grew up in an intellectual family who were repressed during the ruling of Stalin. Oksana studied philosophy at Kyiv University, where she also completed her <u>doctorate</u> in aesthetics in 1987. Oksana's work is soaked with feminist motives and human relations issues. Her novels are translated into more than 20 languages. Books to read: Fieldwork in Ukrainian Sex and The Museum of

Abandoned Secrets.



Maria Matios: Maria Matios' work has won numerous awards, including the BBC Book of the Year in 2008. She is one of the best-selling writers and influential women in Ukraine, a former deputy at the Verkhovna Rada of Ukraine (Parliament), and an extremely fruitful writer. Maria's first poems were published at age fifteen.Maria bases her books on the unique experiences of her family, whose roots go back as far as 1790. Books to read: <u>Sweet Darusia</u> (2003) and <u>Hardly Ever Otherwise</u> (2012).



Iren Rozdobudko: A contemporary writer, journalist, and screenwriter, Iren Rozdobudko is the author of almost 30 works of art. She is included in the top 10 most published writers in Ukraine. Iren was a scriptwriter for the 2014 Ukrainian drama *The Guide*, which was Ukraine's entry for the Academy Award Best Foreign Language Film. Lina Kostenko: This poetess and writer is legendary in Ukraine and abroad. A distinctive feature of her works is intellectualism. In her poetry, the author's themes are the mystery of being, the feeling of love, and Ukraine's history. Lina's poetry collection *300 Poetries, Selected* went out of stock within the first month of publication, as did her only novel, *Notes of the Ukrainian Insane*, showing the life of Ukrainian society during the times of the Orange Revolution in 2004.
