The Simple Truth: New Calculation, Entrenched Problem

AAUW will soon release the **annual update** to our signature report **The Simple Truth about the Gender Pay Gap.** It's a particularly interesting analysis because, for the first time, AAUW and our coalition partners analyzed the **earnings of all workers**—including seasonal and part-time employees—to capture a more accurate picture of the **post-pandemic labor market**. The report found women took home only 77 cents for every dollar men did in 2021.
