The Livermore Lab Foundation (LLF or the Foundation), a nonprofit philanthropic partner to Lawrence Livermore National Laboratory (LLNL), that is now actively recruiting undergraduate STEM fellows for Summer 2024. The Foundation is dedicated to advancing scientific knowledge and inspiring the next generation of science and technology leaders at LLNL through research and through student STEM fellowship opportunities. These paid fellowships connect students to LLNL's premier innovation, technology and research capabilities, with a focus on those historically underrepresented in the field (women, minorities, low-income/financial need, and first-generation college students).

FROM AAUW OF CALIFORNIA

The National Conference for College Women Student Leaders, or NCCWSL, is an annual AAUW conference that brings together more than 800 young women from across the country for two and a half days of leadership training, networking, and inspiration. The California Online and Oregon Online branches recently held a seven-person panel of recent attendees. ADVOCACY

At some point, most workers will need time away from work to deal with a serious personal or family illness, or to care for a new child. Yet many workers can't afford to take leave without pay, forcing them to choose between their family or their job.

Paid leave is an equity issue. Women are often the primary caretakers for children and aging parents, yet the workers in the United States who lack access to paid leave are disproportionately women, people of color, and low-wage workers.

The FAMILY Act will provide workers with up to 12 weeks of paid leave when they take time for a serious health condition impacting themselves or their family. It would enable parents to take paid leave so they can take newborns to the doctor for important check-ups and immunization. It would enable grandparents to take paid time off to care for their grandchild. It would offer survivors of gender-based violence reprieve from having to make the impossible choice between their safety and their paycheck.
