The Livermore Lab Foundation STEM Fellowships

The Livermore Lab Foundation (LLF or the Foundation), a nonprofit philanthropic partner to Lawrence Livermore National Laboratory (LLNL), that is now actively recruiting undergraduate STEM fellows for Summer 2024. If you have have family or friends who might be interested in these fellowships, please share this information with them

The Foundation is dedicated to advancing scientific knowledge and inspiring the next generation of science and technology leaders at LLNL through research and through student STEM fellowship opportunities. These paid fellowships connect students to LLNL's premier innovation, technology and research capabilities, with a focus on those historically underrepresented in the field (women, minorities, low-income/financial need, and first-generation college students).

Lobby Days 2024

AAUW California's Lobby Days will be held on April 2 and 3, 2024. All members are encouraged to participate in this act of advocacy that is essential for achievement of the organization's legislative priorities. In addition to members, college students will be invited to join the event. Their participation will help with reaching more legislative offices, and this introduction to the organization will inspire these advocacy-minded young people to join AAUW.

A hybrid event is planned this year with meetings scheduled virtually over Zoom as well as in person at the Capitol. Members who live in and around Sacramento will have the option to participate in person. Legislative offices are willing to meet virtually or in person, and the virtual option makes it easier for AAUW members around the state to participate.

Training materials on the bills and the event will be posted on the state website in mid-March, and a mandatory training webinar will be held on March 25.

Lobby Days provide a wonderful opportunity to meet with your legislators and advocate for legislation to promote gender equity and improve the lives of women and girls.

Tech Trek

On Saturday, February 3, 4 to 6 PM, we will again be gathering at the Karlsen home for an afternoon of fun and socializing to recognize 25 years of supporting Tech Trek. Please bring your beverage of choice and an appetizer to share, and don't forget your checkbook. This gathering will allow you to make a difference in a young girl's life through your donation to Tech Trek. Please see the Evite coming the first week of January for additional details.

As many of you know, our branch has been part of Tech Trek since the very beginning--25 years ago. A lot has changed over that time! Each year, our branch sends nine or ten girls for an unforgettable adventure. Twenty-five years ago, the cost was \$500 per girl. Now is it \$1200 for the full camp. This year, estimated costs are as follows:

- \$50 pays for a field trip for one girl
- \$100 provides for a ½ day at camp
- \$200 provides for a full day at camp
- \$600 covers half of a scholarship
- \$1200 awards a full scholarship

Our February 3 fundraiser is very important to the success of LPD's participation in this amazing program. The committee's goal for this event is \$6,000. Every contribution makes a difference, so we hope to see you there!
