At this year's camps, the girls explored Climate Science, Botany, Engineering, Robotics and more. They took a field trip to explore water purification and wastewater treatment up close. Science@Stockmen's Park

Here is a fun event for your AAUW-LPD autumn calendar. Join us for a Quest-sponsored workshop on Saturday, October 04, for "Science@Stockmen's Park" in downtown Livermore. This is a free outdoor event for children, teens, and adults with a focus on the principles of DESIGN-BUILD-TEST. It includes fun science activities, music, and more — plus it's a short event starting at 10 AM and ending at 1 PM.

Our AAUW branch is hosting a hands-on game that's an example of simple programming: 2-3 young players organize game cards so that another player can physically navigate a grid (using those same cards as instructions to move left, right, step, etc.). To avoid a long queue, we will have 2 games going at once.

The AAUW Washington Online Branch is offering a program on Title IX on Wednesday, September 17, 5:30 – 7 PM PST. The panel presentation will explore the historical evolution, current landscape, and future implications of Title IX, with a focus on its impact on gender equity in education, athletics, and beyond. Attendees will gain a deeper understanding of the legal, cultural, and political dimensions of Title IX—from its 1972 origins to the most recent developments in 2025. Panelists will share insights on enforcement trends, lived experiences, and strategies for upholding gender equity in the face of evolving interpretations and challenges.
