

FROM AAUW NATIONAL

A recently released statement from AAUW National states that AAUW is disappointed to see the newly released U.S. Census Bureau data showing that the gender pay gap has widened for the second consecutive year. In 2024, all women working full-time, year-round were paid 81 cents, and all earners (including part-time and seasonal workers) were paid 76 cents for every dollar paid to men. This is a statistically significant setback that underscores a troubling trend: women working full time are falling further behind.

MEMBER SHARING

For those of you who attended the Fall Kick Off, you may remember that there were a lot of positive comments about the corn salad provided by Charlene Granfield. She has graciously shared the recipe below:

Pilgrim Corn Salad--Makes 8 (1/2 Cup) servings

Ingredients:

- 1 /1/2 bags (16 Oz bags) of frozen white corn (I believe the original recipe called for two 11oz cans of drained Green Giant White Shoepeg Corn, but my friend used Trader Joe's frozen Super Sweet Cut White Corn, and that's what I've always used.)
- 3/4 C sweetened dried cranberries or cherries
- 1/4 C chopped pecans
- 2 Tablespoons balsamic vinegar
- 2 Tablespoons olive oil
- 1 teaspoon Dijon mustard
- 1 teaspoon Worcestershire Sauce
- 2 Tablespoons fresh basil (chopped)

Few fresh basil sprigs/leaves

8 pecan halves

Steps:

- 1) In a medium bowl, combine corn, cranberries and chopped pecans; toss to mix.
- 2) In a small bowl, combine vinegar, oil, mustard and Worcestershire sauce with a wire whisk until smooth.
- 3) Add vinegar mixture to corn mixture and add chopped basil. Toss to coat well.
- 4) Let stand 10 minutes.
- 5) To serve, toss gently to mix if needed. Garnish with basil sprigs/leaves and pecan halves.
