## **PUBLIC POLICY**

#### **HISTORY OF THE 28TH AMENDMENT**

Save Saturday, December 13, 10 – 11 AM on your calendar! Our LPD Branch will be joining other Alameda County AAUW Branches to co-host the short virtual presentation *Constitution in Crisis: The History of the Missing 28th Amendment*, by Molly Gonzalez, an Equal Rights Amendment (ERA) scholar and Advocacy Manager for the Alice Paul Center for Gender Justice. The Alice Paul Center is a nationally recognized non-profit organization named for Alice Paul, the primary author of the ERA, and provides education around women's history. Her birthplace, Paulsdale in New Jersey, is a National Historical Landmark (https://www.alicepaul.org/). Molly has created a presentation for us about the past, present, and future of the ERA in California. The 45-minute presentation incorporates historical research, photographs, and action steps followed by15 minutes for questions and discussion. Information on the Zoom meeting link to join the presentation will be available soon in the Friday Update.

## FROM AAUW NATIONAL

It's a hard truth—there is no gender equity without pay equity. The pay gap has had a detrimental impact on people and families for generations. Unfortunately, after many years of slowly narrowing, the gap has actually been widening over the past two years. When including all women earners, women are paid 75 cents for every dollar paid to men. What has AAUW been doing to reverse the situation? AAUW has been providing salary negotiation, financial literacy, and advocacy training to thousands of women. Our signature document, The *Not So Simple Truth*, a gender pay report, is being updated with the most current data to examine root causes of persistent inequities and to highlight policies and practices that can close the pay gap.
